Dr. Foster's practice is nearly 30 years old. It is a source of enormous satisfaction to watch the growth and development of individuals who come to experience the Ocular Immunology Service training program, and while it is always quite sad to see them leave at the end of their training, it provides additional joy to watch their further development in their home lands and to renew acquaintances at the scientific meetings.

I trust that each of our patients, while perhaps sometimes unenthusiastic about being examined by multiple doctors in the course of a visit with us, can also take some pleasure in the knowledge that the patient has also very measurably contributed to the growth of knowledge and the spread of blindness-prevention knowledge around the globe.
