One of OIUF's major goals is to provide emotional support to patients and caregivers with Ocular Inflammatory Disease, partially through our community of patients in similar situations.


Keep reading to learn about Katie's journey with retinal vasculitis.

"In April of 2021, I was diagnosed with an unknown autoimmune disease that causes uveitis and vasculitis in my eyes. It wasn't until I woke up one morning and placed my hands in front of me and realized that I couldn't see the rings on my fingers that I panicked.

Since then, I have been on various medication regimens including pills, infusions both at the doctor's and at home, and injections. With my family and I both nervous and terrified for what was ahead, we were constantly reassured by both Dr. Foster and Dr. Anesi that they had faith we were able to get my condition and symptoms under control.


